



# Thinking and Enacting Justice in a Multispecies World



As the pressures of human exploitation of the planet intensify, the experience of injustice, amongst humans, non-human animals, and the environment also deepen and become more evident. It is also becoming increasingly apparent that our existing frameworks for conceptualising justice and our institutions for delivering it are not up to the task of attending to the multiple dimensions and experiences of injustice in a multispecies world.

Certainly, concern for the wellbeing of, and justice towards, humans, non-human animals and the environment has given rise to ethical frameworks, advocacy approaches and scholarly analyses. Sometimes they intersect, sometimes they are in tension, and sometimes they sail past each other. Potential complementarities, collaborations and frictions are sporadically canvassed within each field, or within a particular discipline; but a systematic, multidimensional analysis of multispecies justice across fields/disciplines has yet to take place.

The principal aim of this series is to establish and lay the foundations for a research agenda on multispecies justice. We are bringing together scholars working in a range of disciplines across the world to discuss how they are approaching the challenges of multispecies justice, and to encounter each other. Together, we hope to start to map the state of the field and its possible trajectory into the future.

## Our four sub-themes are:

1. The moral, legal and political status of humans, animals and the environment;
2. Climate change, nonhumans, and relational impacts;
3. Economic justice, human and non-human;
4. Extinction and biocultural conservation.
